#### **Podcasts and Media**

**PODCAST:** Professor Hickie co-hosts the "Minding Your Mind" podcast with James O'Loughlin, which discusses mental health topics.

As of 26 February 2024, the Professor Ian Hickie and the BMC team have released 156 episodes of the Minding your Mind podcast (162 episodes as of 5 March). These episodes have now been played over 300,000 times, and each episode is on average, listened to 1,840 times. These impressive results confirm that the podcast format is an exceptional way to reach a diverse audience and share clinical research in a user-friendly and digestible way. Further, the BMC has 2,215 followers on Spotify and more still Apple followers as 71% of listeners tune in on Apple, 15% on Spotify, and the remainder on other platforms. Chartable, a podcast analytics site, continues to indicate an average audience review of 4.9 stars out of 5, as it did at the same time in 2023.

**MEDIA:** Professor Hickie has provided regular media appearances nationally on brain and mind sciences: Richard Glover on RN Drive, 24 news, The Drum, RN Breakfast and Health Report. Professor Hickie has also been invited for regular appearances to discuss mental health issues on: 4corners, 7.30 report, Sky news, ABC News. He has also provided commentary on broader issues on health politics and advocacy, body clocks, alcohol and drugs, child and youth development, healthy ageing and employment and mental health. Professor Hickie has also led various panels on Sydney Ideas events and featured in broader popular science features such as Scientific American, The Mandarin and the Conversation.

Professor Hickie has also been on international media to discuss global mental health issues featuring on BBC in the UK and various international podcasts in Singapore and South Korea.

#### **INDIGENOUS PARTNERSHIPS**

*'Right care, first time, where you live'* is implementing two decision-support tools in two Indigenous communities – Pilbara and Central Queensland. This work will be done in collaboration with Professor Pat Dudgeon, Centre of Best Practice in Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Suicide Prevention. Two webinars have also been co-hosted: 1) Tackling racism against First Nations people (April 2024) and 2) Moving forward after the voice referendum (October 2023).
