## Clinical experience

### **General Paediatrician**

I have been on-call as a general paediatrician for at least 40 days per year since 2004.

Since 2007, I have worked at The Children's Hospital at Westmead as a General Paediatrician, where I manage common Paediatric conditions as well as rare tertiary level conditions.

I have work experience in 5 of Australia's states and territories since 1994, including in public & private hospitals, community child health centres, general and community paediatrics, emergency medicine, intensive care (paediatric and neonatal) and retrieval (NETS).

### **Refugee Clinic**

Since 2007 I have worked in the Refugee clinic where we manage tuberculosis (active and latent), malaria, sickle cell disease, as well as cutaneous leishmaniasis and Vitamin D deficiency with and without Rickets.

I have been a strong advocate for the plight of asylum seeker and refugee children including at public forums, newspaper articles and in the medical literature. I have led the service since 2019.

### **Aboriginal health**

My experience includes work in the Northern Territory as a senior paediatric registrar in both Darwin (6months) and Alice Springs (3 months), and as a consultant locum (Port Hedland Hospital in Western Australia, including a clinic in Jigalong- a remote aboriginal community). In these settings, the team managed acutely unwell children with severe acute diarrhoeal disease on the background of chronic illnesses.

### **Asia Pacific**

During my work for the Diploma in Child Health (2007-2010) I was fortunate to visit health care centres, including in Vietnam as well as some remote provincial centres in Cambodia (Siem Reap, Stung Treng, Kampong Speu, Ratanakiri), Solomon Islands (Kilu Ufi), and Vanuatu (Tanna island).

We were able to support medical practitioners in these locations to either consider studying for their Diploma through distance learning and many have since successfully graduated.

I was an invited speaker at Haiphong University of Medicine and Pharmacy talking about research (2013)

I am a regular examiner for University PNG Masters of Paediatrics/Diploma in Child Health (2011, 13, 14, 17)

### **Other**

- Option Term Ragama Hospital, Sri Lanka (Nov 1992 to Jan 1993): As a medical student I worked in a public hospital in Sri Lanka under the supervision of Professor Stella De Silva. I worked on a research project analyzing the daily dietary intake of a village family in Ragama and compared with WHO Recommended Daily Intake. We found their diet was inadequate.
- Medical Officer KIDSCAMP (summer camp for children with diabetes) from 1998-2002: I managed ~30 diabetic children (9-13 years) including ketosis and hypo-glycaemic events.

## Education experience

### ***Child and Adolescent Health Specialty Block***

I was Sub Dean/Academic Leader (Education) for Children's Hospital Westmead Clinical School 2016-22. I was in charge of Assessments for the Child and Adolescent Health Specialty Block of the Sydney Medical Program since 2011 and became CAH Block Coordinator in Feb 2015. CAH is a main component of paediatric teaching of the Sydney Medical Program, with ~300 students annually (~8% of all Australian medical graduates attend CHW annually). CAH has a strong reputation (82-100% Unit of Study Survey satisfaction).

I have been part of major revisions to the CAH Block over the last 5 years, including: introduction of MCQs, introduction of the short answer Clinical Task Paper, modification of the physical examination OSCE station examination process, and the change to a flipped classroom method of teaching with online resources rather than face to face lectures and using experts in Clinical Application Sessions with Experts (CASES).

I was founding member of the Academy of Child and Adolescent Health and joined the Board in 2020 and became Treasurer in 2021. I was the convenor of the ACAH Conference in Sydney (April 2022): "Gamechangers in Child and Adolescent Health", a great success. There were 160 delegates from all 7 states and territories, despite the COVID-19 pandemic. This was a major event with a budget approaching \$100k with \$18k in sponsorships, research abstract submissions in the student, trainee, Higher Degree Research and Open categories. I designed the processes for abstract submission and marking.

#### ***Diploma in Child Health / International Postgraduate Paediatric Certificate Steering Committee***

I was part of the management team for the DCH during the time when we expanded significantly through the Asia-Pacific region. I was instrumental in the introduction of the course to Vanuatu through my Westmead Vanuatu Taskforce links. I also managed the inaugural Australian Leadership Award Fellowship (ALAF) course run through the DCH/International Postgraduate Paediatric Certificate (bringing leading paediatricians from the Asia Pacific region to the Children's Hospital at Westmead & USYD for an intensive leadership course).

### ***Hearing Ear health and Language Services (HEALS)***

I established and managed the HEALS project from 2013-2017. HEALS was initially a NSW Health funded program to provide ENT surgery and speech pathology intervention for Aboriginal children across NSW. To date, we have assisted nearly 1000 children, providing over 8000 speech pathology sessions (>3500 hours of individual therapy) and over 350 ENT operations.

I have helped manage the program from 2019 to 2025 (total budget for this program ~\$4.5 million 2013-2021).

### ***Academic Leader (Education), Children's Hospital Westmead Clinical School, University of Sydney***

Since February 2015 I have been Sub-Dean (now called Academic Leader) Education, responsible for the entire CHW Clinical School Education activities, including: Sydney Medical Program, Pre-Intern, Electives, Masters of Medicine Paediatrics and resident medical officer teaching. There are over 500 medical students and over 40 Masters students each year.
